Sunday Sermon: Romans 1:8 - 17

Continuing the new series based on Romans 1, Sunday's sermon was entitled A Gospel Community in a Godless World.

Paul had not had any direct contact with the church to which he was writing. He had not founded it nor had he visited it at any time despite his longing to do so. He wanted to share with them the gospel that had been entrusted to him and which he had shared with other churches on his missionary journeys. Instead he wrote to them in an epistle which, mercifully, we can access and gain blessing from.

In this introduction to his letter to them he mentions **A Thriving Church** vibrant in its faith and testimony in a city that was noted for its debauchery and was once famously described as "a cesspool of iniquity".

Despite such an environment it was a **Community of Faith** for which he gave thanks and prayed for continually. His desire to visit them in person was to "impart to them "some spiritual benefit.

That benefit was a declaration of the **power of the gospel**. Following his own conversion and changed life he is not only 'not ashamed' of the gospel but convinced of its potency as a radical power able to transform their lives. And he wants them to be sure of it as the real gospel.

The **core of the gospel** is that it is the message of salvation bringing them – whoever they are - release from the guilt of sin and enabling them to continue living that new life. Becoming a Christian and living it is essentially by such basic faith.
