Sunday Sermon: Esther 6

On Harvest Sunday we were reminded that the principles that underpin things like harvest also apply to spiritual development. What is sown now will one day be available for reaping.

Preceding the events outlined in this chapter a programme headed by Haman to ensure the destruction of the Jews was met with a period of three days' fasting by the children of Israel.

Those prayers – and any we might make in desperate situations - are made in the knowledge of the Sovereignty of God. Scripture exhorts us to "believe that God is, and that he rewards those who diligently seek him". While we only see the obvious, behind it all God is sovereign.

His response to prayer and apparently adverse events is largely hidden. God is working out his purposes in the background when "all things work together for good". God is in control.

Although the immediate scenario threatened destruction, what subsequently emerged was protection when Haman's evil plans were overturned to ensure the survival of God's people.

As we think of this event on Harvest Sunday we can be encouraged that our prayers, too, will be answered and God's will be done in ways that we are currently unaware of but can be assured will happen through God's providence.
