"My peace I leave with you" John 14: 23-31

Knowing that his path and theirs are now separating, Jesus prepares his disciples for what lies ahead – and beyond to our day. He wanted to impart his legacy, recognising that difficult times would be ahead for them – just as they are, and will be, for us.

While coping with what lies ahead is something for which they have a responsibility to do for themselves (Paul learned to be content) they need not face it alone. He would give them His Peace.

While obeying <u>his word</u> is the *expression* of love, accepting <u>his peace</u> is the *experience* of that love.

That peace is different from what the world offers. <u>Defined by grace</u>, it is the bestowing of a blessing that will enable them to face the challenges ahead.

It is not a negotiated peace, based on compromise, but <u>shared freely from the heart of God</u>. It is a peace which he *gives*.

It is a peace <u>made secure by his sacrifice</u> as Saviour of the world. Drinking the "cup" that he was about to drink would turn out to be more potent and more powerful than any miracle they had seen so far.

Based on his having 'triumphed over principalities and powers', it is a peace that is <u>safeguarded by his authority</u>. Satan now has no hold on him – or us.

And, it is <u>experienced by the reality of his</u> <u>presence</u> through the Holy Spirit. While he is deservedly with the Father, we – his faithful believers – can know the blessedness of "Lo, I am with you always".
