Sunday Sermon: Christmas Emotions

While the popular perception of Christmas is one of "joy to the world", whether that is the Christian hope of salvation prospects or the increasingly hedonistic indulgence of a godless society, to many it is anything but that. Such positive emotions appear to contradict the reality of the dismal circumstances they find themselves in. 'Negative' emotions such as disappointment, stress, and sadness, all have their place in the Christmas story but are set in the context of Hope.

In the Matthew account of the nativity, the righteous Joseph was clearly disappointed when he was told by the angel that Mary was "with child", with all the shame and stigma attached to that condition. Any aspirations for the future were dashed. What would have been his natural expectation, having diligently followed social conventions, turned out to be catastrophic in his experience. He was disappointed.

Yet that was because of his lack of full knowledge and understanding that what was happening was part of a divine purpose of which he could not have been aware of at the time. It could be the engineering of God's purpose through these changing circumstances. But, disappointment can be dealt with by accepting that God is working out His purpose and that what would appear to be failure or disaster can, with acceptance, be a blessing.

Whatever our emotions might be this Christmas let us, too, "be glad" when we are told the "good news".
