Sunday Sermon: 1 Thessalonians 4: 1-12

Yesterday's visiting preacher was Gordon Thomson of the Faith Mission and a frequent visitor to, and friend of, Allander. He took the opportunity to thank Allander for generously letting FM use the premises for the monthly Rallies and for Rejuvenate for young people on a Saturday night each month. And for prayer and financial support.

Based in 1 Thessalonians 4, his message was entitled **Living to please God**.

These people had already taken a significant step in pleasing God "when you received the word of God, which you heard from us (Paul), you accepted it not as a human word, but as it actually is, the word of God at work in you." For, when they "turned to God from idols" they became Christians and served "the living and true God".

Now he encourages them to continue living to please God "more and more". Against the background of possible stagnation he urges them to apply themselves to monitor and control their practical living and let the Holy Spirit generate holiness in them for "it is God's will that you should be sanctified". While accepting Christ means justification — a once and for all action of God — sanctification is a lifelong, ongoing, practical process.

In an impassioned plea he urged anyone not yet having taken that step to do so; and for those who had, to apply themselves diligently, with the Holy Spirit's enabling, in living to please God.

- The **joy** in living for Christ;
- The joy in serving Christ;
- The joy in knowing Christ; and
- The joy in resting in Christ.

That was followed last week by a return to the second missionary journey, now redirected to Europe, with a visit to Thessalonica, Berea and Athens in Chapter 17. This week we take a look at the letters Paul sent to Thessalonica.

Even the smallest fellowships in Turkey gave unselfishly of its resources and

rushed to help. There is currently in many places a spiritual openness rarely seen. Many are asking Christians why they are helping.
