# The Providential Census: Luke 2: 1 - 7

The old-fashioned concept of Providence means that God not only sees ahead but also uses it to fulfil His own purposes. Nowhere is that more evident than in this incident around the birth of Jesus. Several features emerge from that story.

It reveals the human craving for power, honour and acclaim. Caesar Augustus called this census, not so much for taxation purposes, as to draw attention to himself and his glory as the "father of the fatherland". Yet, at that very time, when this man was exercising his authority, God used the occasion to reveal His power in ordaining the birth of His Son.

It also reveals God's ability to fulfil his word. An angel could have conveyed a message to Joseph about going to Bethlehem but God was using human strategy to fulfil Micah's prophecy that Christ would be born in David's city.

Comforting though that is, the event also reveals that the actual fulfilling of God's will can be an uncomfortable experience for those involved in its execution. Mary accepted gladly the privation of the ordeal. In the balance we have heard mentioned so often recently of the paradoxical combination of God's initiative and human action it can be a challenging task for us to obey.

Yet, at the end of the day, it reveals who really should be worshipped and acknowledged as Lord. While Caesar Augustus and others of his ilk have gone, Jesus, Son of God and Saviour, endures and, He alone, is "worthy to be praised".
