Sunday Sermon: Esther 9: 1 - 17

In a service shortened by the need to finish early for the Milngavie Community Remembrance Service in the Precinct, which John conducted, continuing the series on the Book of Esther appropriately provided a summary of the **Spiritual lessons to be learned from warfare.**

In the story so far the tables had been truly turned. The earlier part shows the relentless opposition to the Jews, led by Haman, and focused on Mordecai's defiance. That culminated in a decree for the total destruction of all Jews in the Province, orchestrated by Haman.

However, with Esther "come into the kingdom for such a time as this" those evil plans were reversed and Esther granted her wish to see her people spared when she found favour with the king who listened to her plea.

That unexpected turn of events shows that, whatever the circumstances, **God protects His people**, especially when they acknowledge Him and seek His face. The day of threatened destruction becomes the door of deliverance. Even martyrdom is an occasion for God's glory to be manifested.

Consequently, we should not fear the enemy yet evil must not be tolerated so His people work towards righteousness. Scripture warns clearly about standing against the foe. That should be done in love and with grace, certainly not with vengeance, for "Vengeance belongs to the Lord". Bold actions are not for our benefit but for His glory.

We use the same phrases, often sing the same hymns and have many of the same traditions but do we all mean the same thing? Professor Howard Marshall used to teach his students that "a word means what the author (speaker) meant it to mean." This is why it is so important that in coming to the Bible we really want to know what God meant when he gave these inspired words to His servant, and not just simply the best opinions of men.
