# Trusting in Troubled Times: 2 Thess 1: 1-4

Returning from holiday, John took us to 2<sup>nd</sup> Thessalonians with its portrait of a model church, yet living through troubled times. In the first of five studies in this book he cited three principles that the church learned: persevering through affliction develops maturity; trusting amid conflict leads to stability; and waiting with discipline cultivates responsibility.

Taking what is contained in these four verses (1) we can be thankful that God still works through human lives. There is an encouragement in seeing a person's spiritual life developing. Two possible reasons for this are: faith grows more and more in adversity. Though faith may be weak it is nevertheless alive and can be strengthened. And, growing faith is manifested in the fact that they loved each other; they felt a bond that persecuted Christians often experience and in doing so shared a common hope.

(2) Truth about God will always prevail.
God is just and represents another perspective on the present situation.
Dwelling on troubled times is counterproductive. It is better to see things from
God's point of view and trust in Him and
His truth in troubled times.

And (3) the action of God in the future (when Jesus returns in judgement and vindication) should shape our living today.

# Fellowship with Other Churches

We enjoy fellowship with other churches. We have a special relationship with our friends at Maryhill and welcome their involvement with us at various times. The Fellowship met recently to discuss the way forward and the outcome was positive. On Sunday evening 25<sup>th</sup> October we began a 6-week course, led by Tommy Millar, discussing Outreach, Children's Ministry and '1-2-1' approaches. Our goal is to reach out to the community with the Gospel. May God give us wisdom and assurance as we move forward. Thank you all for friendship, fellowship and prayer support. It is very much appreciated by us all just as we enjoy being part of Allander.

Jing has shared with us at our prayer times that there is still growing pressure curtailing religious activity in China and Christian gatherings in particular. Let's remember our brothers and sisters there

and the other many areas of the world where persecution is rife and, sometimes, very severe.
