# **Sunday Sermon: The Living Christ**

The purpose of this powerful series has been to show how, within the context of our building our Christian lives on the only worthwhile foundation, we should reflect – and be governed by - the qualities and attributes that Jesus portrayed during his ministry on earth.

Concluding the series, and based on the description given in Acts 1: 1-11, John focused on the resurrection and ascension of Jesus – two important aspects of his ministry because they show how Christianity is not simply replicating the teaching of long-gone teachers but the outworking of the message of a Redeemer who is alive and active in our experience as believers today. The resurrection and ascension give us real grounds for hope.

The resurrection of Jesus is proof of what Jesus was and did when he came to earth. It is the affirmation that Jesus is truly the Son of God, now endowed with authority.

It is also the guarantee regarding the effectiveness of what Jesus came to do. As our substitute he offered himself as a sacrifice for our sins – and rose again: mission accomplished.

And, it provides assurance about our future and daily living. While Satan destroys Jesus gives and ensures life for those who truly believe. Because he lives there is hope.

That is underlined by the fact that, now ascended, he ever lives to make intercession for us; he helps us and has given the Holy Spirit to transform us and will, one day, come back for us.
