Sunday Sermon

Introducing his presentation update on the work of SAT-7, Alastair Lochhead, its Scottish Representative, quoted the Scripture: *Is anything too hard for the Lord?* Applying that to the situation in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) he showed how God used one man's initiative in reaching millions by means of satellite whereas previously there was no significant gospel access possible.

SAT-7's current focus is on presenting the gospel and encouraging the church through a variety of programmes broadcast 24/7 on four different channels. It brings hope to millions and pays particular attention to the needs of women in these countries and that of children deprived of educational opportunities.

Concluding the service around the Communion Table, Jim Gourley focused on the last week of Jesus, beginning with the acclaim of Palm Sunday but soon to be overshadowed by the betrayal, rejection and crucifixion which followed.

Yet, in a wonderful gathering in the Upper Room the night before Calvary, Jesus communed with his disciples, telling them that he was about to depart, leaving them to be his witnesses. He prepared them for what lay ahead by warning them of the difficulties they might encounter but assuring them of the enabling power of God available to them through the ministry of the Holy Spirit.

Finally,

In the days of Hezekiah, Judah was on its knees economically, paying tribute to Assyria. When Hezekiah came into power his priority was not the *Economy* but the *moral state of the nation*. He restored proper worship in the temple and turned Judah away from their idolatry. Hezekiah stopped paying tribute to the King of Assyria. He built new towers, strengthened the walls and created a water-way within the city of Jerusalem anticipating an attack from Assyria. The king of Assyria arrived with his army and besieged the city. His psychological warfare was to demoralise the defenders of the wall declaring that no gods of any nation had withstood him, and that Judah's God was no exception. He sent a letter to Hezekiah to surrender or face the consequences. Hezekiah rent his clothes and laid the letter before God interceding before Him that God's name be honoured. God answered his prayer and sent an angel to destroy the Assyrian army. This teaches us that our priority is the spiritual restoration of God's people and the nation. *"2 Kings 18v5 says "He trusted in the LORD, the God of Israel, so that there was none like Him among all the Kings of Judah, after Him, nor among those who were before Him."* Let us intercede before our God and pray for the nation that God's name be honoured.
