Sunday Sermon 1 Peter 2: 9 - 12

It has been interesting to note how the two main sources of ministry – Bible Study and Sunday sermons - seem to focus on the concept of God raising a People for Himself and being concerned with their witness. Parallels are drawn between Israel in the OT and the Church in the New.

1 Peter 2 has already emphasised that the Church has a sure foundation in the Lord Jesus whom God set forth to be the Cornerstone. Anyone who repents of sin and trusts in the work of Christ in his death and resurrection is privileged to be part of that church.

Today's passage elaborated on that privilege through recognising the identity and purpose of the church. That identity – being a member of the church – is shaped by our response to the message of the gospel. Only those who believe are in. It also recognises the continuity of God's purpose. As it was then, so is it now.

Being described as 'a chosen people', 'a kingdom of priests', 'a holy nation' and 'a special possession' should lead to a humbling reality and realisation of a powerful destiny, sharing in divine authority and exercising spiritual responsibility. That, in turn, is expressed in glorious unity and should be marked by unique characteristics displayed by being distinctive – manifesting the life that can only be generated in us by God the Holy Spirit for a specific purpose, viz. to declare God's praise.

That is the church's amazing testimony.

The adults say we are welcoming and friendly and do freely chat to us about things going on in their lives. Over the years people felt confident to send their children to the Wednesday Hashtag and Holiday Clubs. Please pray that people will respond to the gospel. Our desire is to see families coming to the church.
