Sunday Sermon: 1 Corinthians 15: 4-11

Sunday morning saw the start of a new series looking at the ongoing meaning of the resurrection; **Easters over – what's next**? Well, hopefully we see that Easter is never really over and the first message took us to 1 Corinthians 15 vv4-11 where we see that the resurrection of Jesus was central to the message of the church. As Paul reminds the church of what they came to believe, he has to affirm to them the truth of the resurrection for it was facing a challenge from some doubters.

In these few verses we see that the Resurrection of Jesus was a very **SCRIPTURAL STORY**. This doctrine of the Messiah being resurrected was not a New Testament invention but part of God's plan of redemption from the beginning.

We also see that the resurrection was taught because of Jesus' **ATTESTED APPEARANCES**. There is historic record of Jesus being seen risen from the dead and, however mystical that may sound to us, it is what the early church witnessed to.

Finally we see that the resurrection of Jesus is a **TRANSFORMATIONAL TRUTH** as the reality of it made such a difference to so many people so quickly in the world. Some very ungodly lives were turned around and Paul himself witnessed that
