Sunday Sermon: Christ's Character

Continuing the series on the Person of Christ this Sunday's message, based on Revelation 1: 12 – 18 and John 1: 14 focused on the question: What is He like?

Full of grace and truth. The aged John, reflecting on the Jesus that he knew and loved declared that He was full of grace and truth. As the Word, He is the revelation of all that God is. He declared himself to be The Way, The Truth and The Life. And as truth, He spoke clearly in a way that people recognised. But He did so graciously, even when rebuking. That should characterise our behaviour: speaking divine truth and doing so with grace. God wants to develop these characteristics in us as his disciples.

Holy. Jesus was not only holy in the sense that He was sinless and perfect but also in His dedication and being set apart. His reply to anxious parents, "Don't you know that I must be about my Father's business" bear testimony to this.

Love. Jesus showed compassion and concern for others, especially those in need. He wept over Lazarus and wept over Jerusalem. But His greatest act of love was to die for us on Calvary. "Greater love hath no man than this". He could say, "As the Father has loved me so love I you" and follow that with "Love one another as I have loved you".

Humble. That meant condescension. He came to serve, not be served.

Yet He was – and is – realistic in wanting us to be like Him in all His character. His command to us is: put it into practice.
