Sunday Sermon: 1 Thessalonians 1: 1-10

Yesterday's services were taken by our good friend Gordon Thomson who, in his inimitable style and inspiring stories, took us to 1st Thessalonians and the lessons we can learn from the first chapter.

Paul greeted the Thessalonians with thankfulness because of the kind of life they were living. Following a genuine conversion and the change that had been brought about through that experience they were shining examples of the difference accepting Christ makes.

Just as they had been chosen by God as exemplars, so we should be shining lights in our situations – however difficult and arduous that might be. Even in the strange days we are living through, God can sustain us. So, we should bear testimony to what God has done for us as expressed in the words contained in one of the hymns that was played: "Through it all, I've come to trust in Jesus; I've learned to trust in God

The secret of that change was their acceptance and reception of the word of God – the gospel - despite much affliction. As a result, they had "turned to God from idols to serve the living God". In the same way we should put our faith in that gospel and let God change our lives and, having done so, be totally committed to serve God fully in our situations in a way that glorifies Him.

Blythswood Shoe Box Appeal

As intimated over the past two weeks, we are again supporting the Blythswood Care Shoe Box Appeal which will still be taking place this year. More than ever the need for support is very considerable given the current living conditions in the countries Blythswood supports. Leaflets are available, with new guidance which will now apply in view of Covid.

We are asking that all boxes are brought to the Church by Sunday 1st November. If you are unable to come to Church personally then we can arrange for the box to be uplifted.
