Sunday Sermon: Palm Sunday

Naturally, and continuing the study on the aspects of the life of Jesus, the focus on this Sunday was on the Triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem where the crowd hailed him with shouts of Hosanna and waved palm branches in his honour.


Taking the intriguing title – 'The hero you get is not the hero you want' John explained how oppressed societies and even depressed individuals look for a hero who will come and meet their perceived needs. National fervour was such that it fed on the stories of Jesus' wonderful works of healing and teaching. The expectation was that here, at last, was their King, the one who would restore national pride, the one who would bring 'deliverance to the captives'. Palm branches and Hosannas were fitting, tributes to such a Messiah.

But, they were mistaken. While their expectations were for a Champion, Jesus came as a humble servant, riding on a donkey. He came to fulfil a mission, as the Zechariah prophecy foretold. He came to bring peace; salvation for every nation, not just the Jews; and to shed his blood for the redemption of humanity, thus conquering death and Satan.

So what should our response be? The crowd was disappointed and so cried out 'Crucify him'. Yet, he had come to bring salvation and, after his vicarious death and triumphal resurrection will, in due course, return again one day as the Mighty King. So, on this Palm Sunday, it is important to understand that, to 'believe in him', and to offer our grateful praise.

John is convinced that we must know the reality of fellowship with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ before we can know the reality of fellowship with each other in our common relationship to God.

May we all know and have a desire to strengthen our fellowship with God the Father, God the Son and with each other.
