# Sunday Sermon: Esther 5

Continuing the series on the Book of Esther, this chapter, set in the context of events taking place that seemed to be dominated by "the enemy of souls", is focused on **Responsibility and Providence.** Given a situation where a death sentence had been pronounced on the Jews, how was God's will to be put into practice? It entailed both God's sovereign working and the practice of human responsibility.

What do these situations call from us as God's people with an underlying conviction that God is in control.

Essentially it means being committed to prioritize God's purpose. Esther had been brought to the point that the outworking of God's purpose took priority over her personal welfare. That was manifest in a clear dependence on prayer for, knowing what lay before her in her approach to the king for release for the Jews, she had mobilised prayer and fasting for success in her venture.

In pursuing her (God-inspired) initiative she made progress patiently and even was happy to suffer the enemy's pride when Haman boasted of his anticipated triumph in persecuting God's people. She knew that she could trust in God's unseen power. That was vindicated as we shall see in the next chapter.

That challenges us to be aware of our responsibility to 'give ourselves' in taking up spiritual initiatives knowing that "it is God working in you both to will and to do of His good pleasure".
