#### Sunday Sermon: Luke 1: 46 - 80

Concluding the series on faith, based on the events recorded in Luke 1, John emphasised that both Mary's Song – the Magnificat – and that of Zechariah illustrate the **Celebration of faith.** 

The events of this chapter and the songs that characterise the response to them reflect the joy that there is evidence that, after years of apparent silence, God is now moving in bringing about redemption for His people. They reflect:

**God's work.** Events such as the miraculous conception of John the Baptist to an aged Elizabeth and Zechariah and the birth of Jesus to the virgin Mary are all acts of God. They are things He has done and brought about. Just as in Creation He spoke and things came into being so now He has spoken again and things have happened. The response is both personal, affecting individuals, and corporate relating to the nation.

**God's mercy.** It is the kindness of God to self-confessed unworthy, humble and underserving subjects.

**God's salvation.** They are actions with a redemptive purpose for they establish the means of salvation - with mercy bringing forgiveness and grace a divine enabling.

So, what should **our response** be? An acknowledgement that God in His mercy has provided the means of salvation through the saving work of Jesus whom He sent into the world *"to save sinners"*.

"At Calvary's Cross is where you begin When you come, as a sinner, to Jesus."

# Inga and Sue's projects in Mexico

It does not seem all that long since Inga was with us here in person at Allander. Now back in Oaxaca she, along with her colleague, Sue Hugghins, is fully engrossed in the work of translating the Scriptures. Part of that is not only revising the translation but also obtaining useful

# feedback from local users and dialect speakers to make the translation more understandable, accurate and userfriendly. This means visiting these areas in teams and then making changes in the light of suggestions - a painstaking task. Some of it is done electronically using apps on phones which is dependent on often unreliable internet connections and power supplies.

Alongside of that, Inga herself is heavily engaged in training other translators and making valuable contributions to a better understanding of linguistics, publishing articles, teaching on-line courses and participating in numerous online meetings and consultations with other specialists.

Over some of our next issues we will publish extracts from the helpful weekly prayer news that comes from them to help us maintain our prayer support for the work.
