Sunday Sermon: Psalm 138

Continuing the series on Advent from the Psalms, John focused on Psalm 138 under the intriguing title of *Christmas Treats*.

At a time of the year when thoughts of giving and receiving gifts are uppermost in people's minds, this Psalm reminds us of the gifts that come to us from God as we appreciate his purposes and actions in everyday experiences. Here, David gives thanks to God for:

An everlasting kingdom. Surrounded by 'gods', often depicted as idols, the Psalm reminds us that in the birth of Jesus God "gave his only begotten Son". He was the greatest gift possible in fulfilment of the promise that a Messiah would come and that in Jesus there would be the beginning of an eternal kingdom – the kingdom of God.

David also recognised **an exalted word**. The only hope for a deluded humanity is in what God says. Elsewhere, the Psalmist declares that "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path". And Jesus said, "The words I speak, they are life".

As the nativity announcement was made to Mary in humble circumstances so the gift of God's word comes to us as an expression of help in the ordinary experiences of life. These are frequently identified with difficult times and moments of despair but they breathe life.

And, in their potency, they declare **an expectation of purpose** as we rejoice in the truth of Immanuel – God with us.

Thanks be to God for His unspeakable gift.
