Sunday Sermon: Colossians 3: 12 - 17

The visiting speaker yesterday was Sam Gordon who based his sermon on Colossians 3 and its presentation of Jesus as the full embodiment of God, and the implications of that for Christian living.

The earlier verses in the chapter speak of Living with Christ (1-4), Living in Christ (5-7) followed by Living for Christ (13-17), with verse 12 emphasising the need to Live like Christ as a consequence of the transformation that takes place when we receive Christ as our Saviour.

Jesus changes people. The outcome of that transformation "from the inside out" giving believers a unique position as special people in the eyes of God and also significant in today's world.

That privileged position, resulting from saving faith in the gospel, means that we are chosen to be loved by God and to be lights in the world in which we find ourselves.

With that confidence, knowing that we are numbered among his redeemed, we have an obligation to live like the Lord Jesus by demonstrating – as He did – compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. We should bear with one another, forgiving whatever grievances there might be, and above all practise divine love. Difficult though that may be, the peace of God and His indwelling word will help us.

Being loved by God is a great privilege bestowed by grace. Receiving that love and responding to it practically is an ongoing responsibility.

Here are some of the latest items from Inga and Sue's weekly prayer letter from Mexico.

Inga has been revising Galatians with the Nuxaá team. They are checking key terms in Mixtec and making them consistent with other Epistles. They also finished revising Philemon

Inga has continued revising the paper comparing how conditional clauses work in different languages, including Greek and Mixtec.

Inga's meeting with the other staff members of the linguistics training program in the UK went well. She has a lot of work to prepare for the course that she will be teaching mid-April to the end of May. She is the course head.

Platform 67

At last week's Prayer meeting Martin Dudgeon of Platform 67, brought insights of what is happening in various parts of the world. Emphasising the responsibility for mission in terms of outreach overseas to other nations, he described various approaches adopted by groups they support to communicate the gospel in lands where persecution and restriction dominate. These include the provision of recorded messages on miniature devices, adaptation of sign languages and even using portions of the Bible as reading material when testing free reading glasses in China!.
