Sunday Sermon: John 1: 1 - 18

Sam Gordon, our visiting speaker yesterday, shared truths from this well-known passage with us, showing that in it we see Jesus both as He is and also as He was.

He is both bigger than we think He is and also greater than we think He is. He was the expression of God in all his fulness. He was the Word. Introduced as being in the beginning, from eternity, he is presented as not only being with God but as God, not created but eternally existing.

As such, he is the source of life. That life was – and is – the light of men: a life and light that is transforming.

He is not only the source of life but also the sustainer of life. John the Baptist heralded him and introduced him to others. Sadly, although he came to his own they rejected him. But, those who did receive him have the privilege of being called the children of God.

Reception of Christ through saving faith is the secret of overcoming darkness. For, with him comes not only grace but also an experience of the glory of God incarnate. Truth for living a Christian life is a knowledge of that grace for it is the reason for confidence, the resource for living and the enabling power,
