## Sunday Sermon: 1 Peter 1: 13 - 25

Having reminded the believers of the benefits of salvation, expressed in the words: "now that you have tasted that the Lord is good", Peter goes on to emphasise that an appreciation of those blessings should lead to action and expression in their behaviour as Christians.

Of course, if anyone as yet has not "tasted that the Lord is good" then none of these benefits or challenges will apply. That is something that must be – and can be settled first.

For those who have, then they need to **prepare their minds** and think through their faith both in self-discipline and in exercising hope for the future.

It also needs **spiritual aspiration** by 'not conforming' to this world and its desires but to be holy as obedient children living a life that is distinctive because of following the ways of God.

There is also to be a **reverent appreciation** of this new bestowed life, made possible by the application of the "precious blood of Christ" and its effective outworking in practical living.

Out of **reverent fear** for God, his holiness, and all that he has done and applied in our lives, then there is a responsibility to reflect that holiness of God in *"loving each other deeply from the heart"*. That is made possible because Christian experience comes from being *"born again through the living and enduring word of God."* That word endures for ever and is the word that is consistently preached in these sermons.
