Sunday Sermon: Genesis 3: 1 - 21

Starting a new series on *When God asks Questions,* in yesterday's sermon John focused on the first question in Genesis: Where are you?

God does not ask question because he is lacking information but in order to evoke a response. The point of asking Adam 'Where are you' is to get him to see where he is in terms of his relationship to God.

The implicit answer to the question in this instance is that Adam is hiding among the trees. Because of what has happened prior to this, Adam is feeling guilty and fearful of appearing in God's presence. Possibly because of this awareness he and Eve 'make garments' for themselves to hide their nakedness. That is in contrast to the idyllic picture described at the end of chapter 2 where God freely met with Adam for fellowship 'in the cool of the day'. That is the natural state of humanity to this day – conscious of being guilty before God and fearful of his presence.

In its intention, the question was not punitive, but redemptive. God was looking for confession. Significantly, God 'made' other and better garments for humanity – from skins that implied the sacrifice of animals to produce them.

That question is being asked of us today. Where are we in relation to God? If we are honest before God, our behaviour can be one of guilt and fear that we, too, are far from where we should be. But we have a saving God who is ready to clothe us with 'garments of salvation' if we confess, repent and believe.

Mission of the Month

Over the past two months contributions have been made to the representation work of the Christian Institute and the work of MAD Ministries. In June the sum of £400 was sent to the Christian Institute and in July £300 to MAD Ministries.

The Mission of the Month for August is **The Scottish Bible Society**. As well as distributing Scriptures across many countries, the SBS is developing some very interesting materials in digital form. Mark Girvan – who with his wife Justine – has been worshipping with us at Allander for a few months is involved in its promotion.
