Sunday Sermon: 1 Corinthians 15: 35 -49

While last week's sermon dealt with the past in that the resurrection of Jesus and what he accomplished through that experience meant the defeat of death ("by destroying principalities and powers triumphing over them in it"), this week's sermon looked ahead and showed that the resurrection signals A Glorious Future.

Christian testimony bears witness to this, none more so than in the sentiments expressed in the "negro spirituals" sung by African slaves as they exercised hope in very adverse circumstances.

The Resurrection – of Jesus and of those who believe in him - means **continuity** with the present. In nature a seed 'dies' and is re-formed: similarly those who 'die' in repentance and trust are 'born again' of the Spirit of God.

But, there is also a **contrast with the present**. It is not 'more of the same'; a simple repeat of what was but a regeneration with a new body and better features. It is spiritual, being born of God, superior to our present existence. Eternal, incorruptible, raised in glory. We shall be 'like Him'.

It corresponds to our present source of

life. While natural life comes through genetic inheritance, spiritual life comes from Jesus, our "heavenly Father". That is why we must be "born again".

That blessed truth of being blessed in Christ who (following his resurrection) is seated with God in heaven brings us comfort in the midst of everyday life.
