Sunday Sermon: Romans 1: 18 - 32

Paul's letter to the Romans is unique in many ways. In it he is discharging a 'debt' to the Roman church which he had not founded or yet visited. So, as a 'servant of Jesus Christ' and an 'apostle to the Gentiles', taking nothing for granted, he declares to them the whole gospel.

That gospel is 'concerning Jesus Christ' and one of which he is not ashamed because it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone who believes. It is a gospel in which the wrath of God is revealed against ungodliness and unrighteousness but offers a righteousness as a gift from God.

In this section Paul explains why they need such a gospel.

In the first place it is **because of God's wrath.** The whole range of human
behaviour that ignores God's
requirements and intention for humanity
which he created but has ignored that
Creator. God's wrath is as intensive and
extensive as is His love. It is fearful.

Secondly, it is because we are guilty. The list of wrong behaviour listed in this chapter is uncomfortably familiar and representative of our contemporary actions. There is no excuse. The facts are stark. God has 'given us over' to our own sinful ways.

Thirdly, it is **because we** (because we are guilty) **need to be rescued – or 'saved'**.

That rescue can become effective when we repent and believe, accepting the righteousness which God offers.
