#### Sunday Sermon: Matt 2: 13 - 23

On this first Sunday in Advent, James Fraser, Scottish Representative of Release International, based his message on the events recorded in Matthew 2 where Joseph and Mary fled to Nazareth because of Herod's infanticide persecution, and drew parallels with situations today in various parts of the world.

The first point was that **God's King (Jesus) was opposed.** The initial perpetrator was Herod, a wicked earthly king, known for his cruelty and obvious fear that his own authority was being threatened. That situation affects many persecuted Christians today in countries like Pakistan, China, Africa and the 'third world'. Totalitarian governments, other world religions and an increasingly secular society show a militant intolerance towards Christian believers.

But the story also shows how **God's King** (Jesus) was preserved. That did not mean that they were sheltered or exempt from persecution but protected as they went through it. God intervenes – as He did with Moses in Exodus – by guiding His people, leading them through difficult circumstances, providing that inner strength as illustrated in several examples cited from countries where Release International Partners are located. That strength is based on the fact that Jesus Himself faced both opposition and preservation through the Cross and the resurrection, thus establishing hope.

For our part we can support by prayer and practical help as we respond to this very real need.
