Harvest Sunday Sermon

On this Harvest Sunday John based his sermon on Psalm 104 – a companion psalm to 103 – extolling God's work in creation.

While 'harvest services' are traditional in churches they may have little Scriptural warrant as such other than as genuine acts of thanksgiving for the providence and provision of God. Increasingly the link between planting and product is less obvious. The practice, nevertheless, has significant lessons and spiritual application for us, for:

<u>Harvest is a sign of God's pleasure</u>. Not only is it an expression of his goodness and generosity: it is something that he delights in and brings him satisfaction. As the Aaronic blessing in Numbers 6 shows, God loves to bless. And, righteousness in the believer delights God at all times.

Harvest is a sign of God's presence. It is God that gives the increase. While others sow and contribute to nurture, it is God who provides the increase and without Him there is no life. As Philippians says: *"it is God that works in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure"*.

Harvest shows the source of life. The product is derived from what God gives. Peter declared: *"To whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life"*.

<u>Harvest speaks of the purpose of life</u>. To what extent can it be said of our Christian testimony, having received Christ in our hearts, that *"herein is my Father glorified that you bear much fruit"*?

Mission of the Month

This month's Mission of the Month is Blythswood Care who provide relief and support for needy people in many areas of the world and especially in Eastern Europe.

One of the main ways churches can help in this work is by providing Shoe Boxes full of materials appropriate for needy families, especially at Christmas.

A leaflet was issued yesterday (and can still be obtained) listing what is appropriate for including in a 'shoe box'.

Filled boxes should be brought to the church this month and no later than Sunday 31st October so that they can be collected by the Blythswood lorry and transported in time for Christmas.
