Sunday Sermon: 1 Peter 3 - 12

Resuming the series on Peter 1, John, returning after a two-week break, took the theme: **Rejoicing in trials** – a very powerful and timely message for so many at this time.

In a context where the believers in Rome were facing horrendous persecution at the hands of the authorities - and their unbelieving fellow citizens, Peter encourages the Christians by reminding them of the truth and relevance of God's word; pointing out the paradox of Christian practice in such circumstances.

What made it bearable and acceptable lies in the **truth of salvation**. God had sent His Son to be a Saviour and those who believed in him were assured of that victorious redemption.

Aware of that transforming truth, they could benefit from the **power of praise**, acknowledging what God has done through the gospel. They were to remember **the reality of their salvation**. Pressure becomes an opportunity to experience the overcoming effect of the truth. What we have in God is greater than any hardship we may suffer.

It is important to understand the purpose of trials and the privilege of living in and through these times so that faith is proved genuine. Further inspiration comes through the pattern of Christ who went from suffering to glory; and the blessed assurance of the strength that he bestows.

Such blessings can only apply to those who truly have accepted His salvation.

#### **More Reflections**

Continuing Margaret Baird's reflections on Numbers 10 – 17:

Ch16: Korah, Dathan & Abiram incited a rebellion that included 250 others. Again it seemed to be about position — they resented the position Moses and Aaron had. Korah was a Levite, he seemed to forget that God had given him and his fellow Levites an important position in the worship of God. They wanted more. Moses got it right when he said they were really rebelling against God.

Sin and pride made them forget that God is sovereign and history had failed to impress on them the dangers of opposing God. Korah, Dathan, Abiram and their families were swallowed up by the ground and the 250 men with the incense burners were destroyed by fire. It seems amazing that the people dared to grumble the next day, blaming Moses and Aaron for the deaths. In the end it was only Moses and Aaron's intervention that stopped the Lord destroying them all.

Over the period of Covid, John has often focussed on God's sovereignty. A modern hymn has the line, "He still reigns and He is God". The lesson I felt came from these chapters is that if we forget that God is sovereign our focus moves to ourselves, we can be overwhelmed by all that is going on and fail to trust God as we should.

Or it can cause all sorts of problems for God's people. As Aaron and Miriam focussed on Moses' marriage, we can focus on minor details which become giant problems and can destroy our witness.

As we put God first, recognise His sovereignty and trust Him to lead and guide us, we will be united and better able to reflect His love to others.
