Sunday Sermon: Romans 2: 17 - 29

Writing to the Romans, Paul presents the gospel as the offer of God's righteousness in Christ to replace human wickedness. The background to that offer is the declaration that the wrath of God is against all ungodliness and unrighteousness. God will judge the human condition which is amply illustrated in the wrong actions outlined in chapter 1. There is a coming storm.

As a preliminary, John clarified the fact that for God to judge – on the basis of evidence – is perfectly in order as happened several times in OT history; and reminded us that Christ is the only safe shelter from such judgement.

Turning to chapter 2, it was obvious that two groups of people felt that they were exempt from any such judgement. On the one hand there were those who considered themselves morally superior and on the other those who depended on religious tradition.

Neither position is valid, for it is not based on knowledge of, but on actual practice. There is the **delusion of hypocrisy** – knowing but not doing, and assuming all is well when in practice it is far from being the case.

The counter to such delusion is **the glory of the gospel** which declares that "all have sinned" but also speaks of the fact that Christ died for our sins and thereby ensured that "the wrath of God was satisfied". Refuge frim that coming storm can be assured by repentance and saving faith in the sacrifice of Christ for us.
