Sunday Sermon: 1 Peter 2: 18 - 25

Concluding this series from 1 Peter 2 on how to live as Christians in an environment of hardship this week's section focused on Christ's example of Godly living. It highlights the need to radiate hope to the lost and to live life as a testimony to God's garce.

That means that **Mission is in the mundane.** The sphere of witness is not
involvement in major projects or Christian
ventures but in the ordinary contexts of
day by day life: as employees, husbands,
parents, neighbours, etc. Faith makes
ordinary life holy as we live life motivated
by keeping our eyes on the glory of God.

That is motivated by looking at the **example of Christ's own experience** in being God incarnate and willingly undertaking the task of being our Redeemer. As Jesus Christ He suffered, becoming obedient unto death *even death on a cross.* Jesus suffered for us. He faced unjust suffering and yet, he trusted in God, enduring meekly all that sinbearing and *'contradiction of sinners'* meant for him.

Through his suffering and vindication by the resurrection he **empowers us to live** as he lived - with an infusion of new power and the application of redemptive healing because of a dynamic consciousness of God.

Baptism

What a blessed scene last Sunday (20th February, too late to appear in last week's Newsletter) when we were privileged to witness the dedication of young Shu Yu Yu and the baptism of her parents, MinQin Yu and Hai Yong Yu. They are members of the Chinese church which meets at Allander under the pastoral oversight of Jing.

Theirs was the latest in a series of baptisms over recent years, nearly all of which have been of Chinese believers.

What about Allander? Is there anyone of us enjoying the welcome, warmth, and ministry of the church who has yet to take that step of faith and answer positively the three questions put to MinQin and Hai Yong, which were: (1) Do you repent of your sin and intend to follow Christ? (2) Do you believe in Jesus Christ as your Saviour and Lord? And (3) Will you seek to live within the fellowship of His church and to serve Him? Or any one of us who can, but has not yet taken the step of public confession.

Maybe now is the time to think seriously about these matters? If so, why not seek out John Macleod or one of the Elders to discuss the matter further.
