### Sunday Sermon: Isaiah 1: 1-9

Yesterday's guest preacher was Simon Turner, no stranger to us at Allander.

His sermon was titled **The Lord calling to account** based on Isaiah's opening verses addressing Israel and her departure from God. That reflects our situation when it is obvious that externally our world is in a mess and internally we fall short of what is expected. Humanity seems to want rights without exercising responsibility; whereas the Bible teaches that *"everyone will give account of themselves to God"*.

In these verses there was a definite **charge**, an indictment for rebellion and disregard for God in their life and behaviour. That same charge applies to us for we all *"like sheep have gone astray"*. We rebel against God and turn from His ways. We are all sinners, *"and come short* of the glory of God".

That waywardness has **consequences**. For them, it was not only future judgement but disintegration and debility. Sin has that effect. It makes the sinner aware of their lost estate. The hymnist expresses it as being *"vile and full of sin"*. Even Paul cried out *"O wretched man that I am"*. Conviction is being aware of that condition.

The gospel is always positive and speaks of a **caveat** – good news that that need not apply, for God has made a provision through the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus so that turning to Him in repentance and faith can mean salvation and new life. Praise God, "There is a Redeemer, Jesus God's own Son".

## **Children for Christ**

The church has had a long involvement with Children for Christ with the late David Jack looking after much of its business administration and John Macleod – along with teams and individual volunteers – spending time in the country helping at camps and contributing in ministry, training and practical projects.

The work consists of an orphanage and a series of summer camps for children, now led by Romanian personnel. One encouraging feature is the number of excampers and beneficiaries coming back to help and service the work.

Practical support is ensured by collecting items of clothing and other relevant artefacts for use at the camps and centre as well as being sold in the charity shop out there to help fund projects. Allander's support has been, and is, substantial.
