Sunday Sermon: Romans 5: 1 - 11

In the previous four chapters of this key epistle Paul has outlined human sinfulness as being universal (all have sinned) and fatal (the soul that sins, it shall die). But, against that, God's merciful righteousness in Christ is revealed so that a believer is justified by faith. That justification — forgiveness and reinstatement by new birth — leads, in chapter 5, to **The Benefits of faith** in Jesus and His sacrifice on Calvary on our behalf.

It means access into a new reality which brings with it:

- Peace that passes understanding

 a sense of being justified and
 accepted by God;
- A permanent position in grace
 with the prospect of all the Godgiven accompaniments of that new
 state of being declared right with
 God;
- Pleasure in the purpose of life.
 Access into this new grace opens
 the door to future blessedness
 achieved for us by Jesus;
- And even through inevitable hardships there is the blessing of perseverance in pain. And, above all,
- The promise of presence.

All this – justification, access, survival - is only possible because Jesus died instead of us to reconcile us to God. Now that He is risen he continues to save us by his everlasting life. It is the **power of the Person we believe in.**
