Sunday Sermon: Romans 5: 12 - 21

Continuing the presentation of the gospel by Paul in his letter to the Romans, this section of chapter seems to take another excursion into the spiritual history of God's people to explain the significance of particular features.

Having established the answer to sin as Jesus dying instead of us by his death on Calvary there is also the truth that Jesus will live instead of us by his resurrected life.

In this section, the focus is on leadership and inheritance. The principle of inheritance is the same – it reaches all who belong to that leader; but the nature of the inheritance varies with the leader.

The original and innate leadership of all humanity is that of Adam. As the Genesis story records, **destruction was caused by that first leader.** Through disobedience and rebellion against the expectations of God, sin entered into human nature and remains thus ever since, bringing with it eternal punishment.

However, correction was brought about by our Second Leader: Jesus Christ.

His redeeming action of going to the Cross to pay for our sins (and release us from the original inheritance) and his resurrection by which he now lives in us, needs to be accepted by deliberate faith through which we inherit a new nature through being born again by grace.

That is a transformation that is brought about by the gospel.
