## Sunday Sermon: Romans 4: 1 – 25

In Romans, Paul is setting out God's Plan for salvation as the Divine answer of righteousness to counter the innate depravity of human sinfulness.

Having outlined the universal godlessness and unrighteousness of mankind, God's righteousness is revealed in the Person of Jesus, the Son of God. That is the gospel of which Paul is not ashamed *"for it is the power of God unto salvation"*. It is His **Perfect plan**. There are several features to that Plan.

In the first place there is the **consistency** of it. Ever since the Fall, and especially in the new beginning with Abraham's call, it has always been God's plan to rescue and bring into being a people for Himself.

There is also the **impartiality of it** in that it is intended for anyone, whether Jew or Gentile. The promise to Abraham is before he was identified as the father of the Jews.

The key to its efficacy, as set out in this chapter, is Abraham's faith. He took God at His word: he believed *that God would do exactly what he said he would do*. It was not earned by individual merit but credited because of confidence placed in Another and what He would do. In Abraham's case that involved the miraculous birth of Isaac. That shows the **supremacy of God's plan.** 

Finally, and critically, is **the opportunity it presents** for each of us, as we acknowledge our sinfulness and inability to merit salvation, to exercise our personal faith in this glorious gospel.

The church has had a long involvement with Children for Christ ,with the late David Jack looking after much of its business administration and John Macleod – along with teams and individual volunteers – spending time in the country helping at camps and contributing in ministry, training and practical projects.

The work consists of an orphanage and a series of summer camps for children and now led by Romanian personnel. One encouraging feature is the number of excampers and beneficiaries coming back to help and service the work.

Practical support is ensured by collecting items of clothing and other relevant

artefacts for use at the camps and centre as well as being sold in the charity shop out there to help fund projects. Allander's support has been, and is, substantial.
