Sunday Sermon: Romans 6: 15 - 23

In Paul's account of the gospel to the church in Rome, the emphasis has been on the fact that when "*Christ died for the ungodly*", God not only made provision for forgiveness of sinfulness inherent in human nature but also, by the risen life of Christ, offers eternal life to the believer.

Expanding that truth, the theme for today was **God's great gift of grace.**

Using the familiar picture of slavery (as practised in that society) Paul highlights the principles for living a spiritual life in the light of available grace. The essence of this kind of slavery (or servanthood) is obedience. It also reveals who (or what) the master is. Being a 'slave' (under the bondage of natural, sinful, motives) leads to destruction while being obedient to God means life.

The gospel speaks of a power to set us free from human, sinful, lives. Conversion means release from the domination of Satan to becoming born again as a child of God and under a new Master.

That experience gives a pattern for the life we should now live. Following the old master meant sinful actions. Following Christ means submitting to expected behaviours that reflect His values, expressed by the very same faculties that previously were used to facilitate sin. Holiness means that the tongue that used to curse is now engaged in praise.

It is a difference of consequence; for "the (deserved) wages of sin is death, but the (graciously offered) gift of God is eternal life."
