Sunday Sermon: Psalm 1

Taking a break from the consecutive studies in Romans, John indicated that over the next two months his sermons would feature some of the Psalms.

Beginning with Psalm 1, under the title of **The Song of the Saved,** it was pointed out that this psalm presents the principle of blessing for (any) person through the work of the Person of Jesus.

Starting with the word 'blessed' it shows God's aspiration in that His intention is to proclaim salvation to a humanity that is in desperation because of its waywardness and sin.

That blessedness comes through the application of all that is revealed in God's word and the process of meditation on it.

That done effectively will result in fruitfulness illustrated by the picture of a tree growing in a wilderness but, planted by living waters, able to produce fruit.

That is the potential but it depends on choice. Its acceptance means blessing but to reject it means tragedy and a direction of travel that results in punishment.

Blessedness is based on making the right choice.

Child Evangelism Fellowship

At the service, Simon Snodgrass shared about the work of Child Evangelism Fellowship which focuses on evangelising, discipling and encouraging children to be linked with a church. They also help churches in providing training, resources, encouragement and partnership. Allander was thanked for its support.
