Sunday Sermon: Go and.....Do this...

On a day when both Baptism and the Lord's Supper were celebrated we considered the importance of seeing them together, serving as 'visual aids' of the gospel.

When looking at their **COMMON** FACTORS we see that both are rooted in the Old Testament. Baptism has a forerunner in the ceremonial washings of the Jewish faith and the establishing of a new identity. The Lord's Supper is rooted in the Passover meal which was a celebration of God's redemption of His people from slavery and being formed into a new nation. Other common feature are that they are **both commanded by** Jesus. Baptism is part of the great commission given to the disciples by the resurrected Jesus as he commands the church to go and make disciples of all nations. And, they give insight and understanding of the Gospel, for they both point us to Jesus and all that He has done for us.

Thinking of their **DISTINCTIVE FEATURES** we noted that while Baptism is associated with the *start* of spiritual life, the Supper is a vital part of the *ongoing process* of following Jesus. Baptism is done once only as a mark of new life. A believing individual does it once at the beginning, and then belongs! But, any union needs sustaining and strengthening. Communion sustains by being **taken** many times and **taken together**.

And taken together, after initial baptism, it speaks of the union and communion with Jesus that is at the heart of our faith.
