Sunday Sermon: Romans 8: 31 - 39

The gospel presented by Paul to the Romans, one of which he was "not ashamed" because it is "the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believes" speaks of transformation. Essentially it is the operational replacement of our sinful nature, and its being subject to death, with the righteous life of Jesus. "If we were reconciled to God but the death of his Son, being reconciled we shall be saved by His life".

Having dealt in the earlier chapters with the struggle we experience of realising this transformation, Chapter 8 opens with the assurance of "No condemnation" and presents the working of God the Father, Jesus the Son and the Holy Spirit in ensuring victory so that there is "No separation".

Christ is the glory of the gospel, for he is the source of our security. God gave Him and with Him gives us all things. Moreover, He secures our spiritual protection and makes provision. Jesus endured hardship for us and has destroyed the power of the evil one. And, through his resurrection, he provides all that we need for spiritual life. "Jesus paid it all. All to Him I owe".

Thereby he procures our protection and peace so that no one nor one thing can condemn us. And, through all that Christ has done and is now doing in glory God sustains and strengthens our inseparable union with Jesus.

But, only if we have received that gospel and definitely put our faith in its offer of full salvation.
